The last day of our first week of graveyards was dramatically different than the rest of the week. Officers were extremely busy during the whole shift. During this shift, several people were taken to jail, some on felony charges. Officers responded to an assault and battery in which a 17 yr old stated that he wanted to kill himself. When officers contacted him they found that he had assaulted his family member. The juvenile was arrested and taken to juvenile hall. Towards the end of the night, officers investigated a collision, in which one of the parties was intoxicated. After he was arrested for DUI, he refused to submit to a BAC test. A warrant had to be authored, signed by a judge, and then blood was taken at the hospital. When he arrived at the hospital, he refused to exit the patrol car. Modesto PD assisted the Turlock officer in removing him from the patrol car. After a blood sample was taken, he was booked into the county jail.
